Entries must be received by midnight on **02/28/2025** in order to receive special pre-entry pricing. After **02/28/2025** there is a \$100 late entry fee per Horse; after **03/14/2025** the late entry fee will increase to \$150 per Horse. **ALL STALL RESERVATIONS ARE NON-REFUNDABLE AFTER 02/28/2025 AND ARE SUBJECT TO AVAILABILITY.**

ALL entries must include:

- Completed PFHA entry form (2 pages) with all required signatures
- ALL signed releases
- Current negative coggins
- 14-day in state health certificate
- Vaccination Record showing proof of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus vaccinations within 6 months prior to entering the competition grounds
- Copy of Horse registration
- Copy of current PFHA membership cards for all riders, trainers and owners
- Form of payment- emailed entries must include signed credit card authorization form
- Mailed entries must include check made payable to: Florida PFHA or signed credit card authorization form
- 4% credit card processing fee added to all credit card transactions

CLASS SCRATCHES: Will be issued 50% refund if done the day before the class, scratches done on same day as class will be non-refundable. Stall fees are non-refundable. NO EXCEPTIONS!

50% refund of entry fees issued with Vet Certificate only. Horses will not be able to compete once Vet Certificate is received.

Refunds will be issued within 30 days from last day of the show

Stalls may only be transferred from one owner to another if all stalls are sold out. Upon receipt & approval of transfer request form (available at show office), person receiving stall will be charged full stall fee & person transferring stall will receive refund minus a \$50 handling fee

WARM-UP RING: Only Horse, Rider and Handler will be allowed

FIGURE EIGHT PROCEDURE: (2) Figure eights in one direction and (1) figure eight in the other direction

GELDINGS FOR GOLD PROCEDURE: Each Gelding for Gold Class will be standard procedure. Standard Pleasure procedure. Standard Performance procedure. Standard Fino procedure.

DOGS ON COMPETITION GROUNDS: Dogs must be on a leash at all times on showgrounds

PRESS/MEDIA CREDENTIALS: Press passes will be issued at the sole discretion of Show Management. At the issuance of a press pass, press is expected to follow all event policies and procedures failure to do so will result in forfeiture of credentials. NO EXCEPTIONS!

INSPECTIONS: Before entering the arena, all Exhibitors will be asked to go through a check in area and their horse will be inspected by the Inspection Farrier, Inspection Vet and Show Steward. All exhibitors will come with their horse tacked up but with bit in hand for Steward inspection. Only the bit that is inspected will be allowed in the holding area. Once in holding area, if bit needs to be changed, the Exhibitor and horse must go back through the inspection area, if time permits. First, second- and third-class placements will have their bit checked by Steward at the line- up. NO SPURS PERMITTED IN HOLDING AREA. Horse tack is to be competition ready for the class showing. No training equipment of any kind will be allowed in the holding area, this includes additional bits, draw reins, strings etc. Bags/pails will be inspected. The Inspection Farrier will be checking for lameness and the legality of shoes. Trainer, Owner or Exhibitor may assist in lifting feet. Any horse refusing to have all four hooves inspected will NOT be allowed to compete. NO EXCEPTIONS! Exhibitors shall be familiar with the rules prohibiting soreing as per Paso Fino Horse Association rules, Chapter two, IV, Paragraph E; and with rules concerning shoeing as per Paso Fino Horse Association rules, Chapter two, IV, Paragraph C.

Any Exhibitor that fails or refuses the post-class bit inspection will be disqualified from the class and their placement will be forfeited.

FORBIDDEN SUBSTANCE AND DRUG TESTING: A horse may not be shown in any show if it has been administered, in any manner, any forbidden substance. A forbidden substance is any stimulant, depressant, tranquilizer or local anesthetic which might affect the performance of a horse. For this purpose, a stimulant or depressant is defined as any medication that stimulates or depresses the circulatory, respiratory or central nervous system. Also prohibited are any drugs, regardless of how harmless they might be which by their nature, might mask or screen the presence of any forbidden substance or prevent or delay testing procedures. Random drug testing may be administered at the sole discretion of Show Management.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will

be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "Unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

EXHIBITOR PROBLEMS/SPECIAL REQUESTS: All non-emergency problems or special requests must be relayed through show management to ensure prompt attention.

AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT: It is important to PFHA that everyone involved in our shows and events has the best experience possible. If you have any needs or ADA accessibility issues which we could address in advance to make your experience better, please contact the show chair.

Exhibitors will be notified of any changes or additions to this Prize List as soon as possible via email blast and social media posts.

CALL FOR CLASSES: The public-address system is a courtesy. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have his or her horse at the gate at the start of any class. Every effort is made to maintain a working public address system, but Show Management is not liable for technical problems with the system that may occur. No refund will be made, schedule changed or protest upheld on the basis of a PA failure. Exhibitors will be expected to enter the ring in a timely manner per USEF Rule PF-102 6.b which says "When horses are competing collectively, if horses do not enter in the in-gate ready to participate, after the in-gate is open, within two minutes, a warning is issued, and horses are given two minutes before the gate is closed and judging commences, or the class is canceled."

DISCIPLINE: Exhibitors are hereby notified that the Florida PFHA Board of Directors will strictly enforce and actively support all PFHA and/or USEF rules regarding sportsmanship, conduct & courtesy at all PFHA recognized shows and events. This includes but is not limited to rules that govern owners, exhibitors, agents, trainers, managers, riders, drivers, handlers, competition officials, competition employees and members of the families of the above, individual members of PFHA or any person who acts in a manner in violation of the Rules or

deemed prejudicial to its best interests. Any PFHA and/or USEF violations committed will be subject to the PFHA and/or USEF penalties.

ENTRIES: Show Management reserves the right to decline any entry and return any entry fee before or during the show without liability for further compensation. Exhibitors are cautioned to be aware of and to abide by restrictions concerning exhibiting horses before judges as provided in USEF Chapter 8. Article 804 and PFHA Rules, Chapter Five, IX, General Conflict of Interest Rules Governing Showing under Judges.

PARKING: Horse trailer parking is NOT permitted in barn area. Horse trailers MUST be parked in designated trailer parking areas. **ONLY** golf carts will be permitted in this area. Per Tropical Park Management, once show begins there will not be any vehicles allowed entry into the barn area.

Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges, officials or show staff, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee, other fees and may be asked to leave showgrounds.
